**INSTITUTIONAL DISCLOSURES UNDER THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACT OF 1965,
AS AMENDED BY THE HIGHER EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY ACT OF 2008**

The Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (HEOA), includes many disclosure and reporting requirements. A disclosure requirement is information that an institution of higher education is required to distribute or make available to another party, such as students or employees. For certain topics, institutions are required to make information available to students or others and to submit information to the Department of Education.

Piedmont University provides access to information that will allow consumers such as students, parents, and other interested parties to make informed decisions about postsecondary education. This web page provides a single access point to all federally mandated reports and disclosures.

NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF INSTITUTIONAL AND FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION

Institutions of higher education must annually provide to all enrolled students a notice setting forth the information required to be made available to students under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) and under the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended by the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (HEOA). The notice must list and briefly describe the information and include a statement of the procedures required to obtain the information. For information listed in the notice that is disclosed on an institution's website, the notice must include the exact electronic address and a statement that the institution will provide a paper copy upon request. PRIVACY OF STUDENT RECORDS – FAMILY RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)**

Each institution must provide an annual notice to all enrolled students concerning:

1. the right to review their education records,
2. the right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information,
3. the right to file complaints with the Department of Education
4. provide procedures for reviewing education records and requesting amendment of the records

1. student's name,
2. telephone listing,
3. email address,
4. date and place of birth,
5. major field of study,
6. participation in officially recognized activities and sports,
7. weights and heights of members of athletic teams,
8. visual image,
9. dates of attendance,
10. degrees and awards received,
11. and the most recent previous educational institution attended by the student.

STUDENT BODY DIVERSITY

COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT POLICIES AND SANCTIONS (INCLUDING COMPUTER USE AND FILE SHARING)

Institutions must annually make available to current and prospective students the institution's policies and sanctions related to copyright infringement, including:

1. a statement that explicitly informs students that unauthorized distribution of copyrighted material, including unauthorized peer-to-peer file sharing, may subject the students to civil and criminal liabilities
2. summary of the penalties for violation of federal copyright laws
3. the institution's policies with respect to unauthorized peer-to-peer file sharing, including disciplinary actions taken against students who engage in illegal downloading or unauthorized distribution of copyrighted materials using the institution's information technology system

Unauthorized or unlicensed copying of copyrighted materials (books, periodicals, audio or video programs, or software of any type) is prohibited by federal and international law. Persons conducting such copying or using improperly acquired materials are subject to disciplinary procedures.

File Sharing and Copyright

Piedmont University takes copyright protection very seriously. Many scholars and music artists rely on copyright to protect their intellectual property.

"Peer-to-peer" (P2P) file-sharing applications have made it easy for Internet users to share files with one another. There are many legitimate uses of P2P file sharing, such as updates and software purchases. However, P2P file-sharing applications are also used to share copyrighted material such as songs, movies, software applications, and games without permission. If you upload or distribute copies you make of copyrighted works or download or acquire unlicensed copies of copyrighted works, you may be infringing someone else's rights.

Although using P2P file-sharing technology is not in itself illegal, if you share copyrighted material without permission -- even unwittingly -- you are breaking both the law and University policy and could be subject to University, civil, and/or criminal sanctions.

Summary of Civil and Criminal Penalties for Violation of Federal Copyright Laws

The Department of Education publishes in the Federal Student Aid Handbook a summary of the civil and criminal penalties for violation of federal copyright laws:

Copyright infringement is the act of exercising, without permission or legal authority, one or more of the exclusive rights granted to the copyright owner under section 106 of the Copyright Act (Title 17 of the United States Code). These rights include the right to reproduce or distribute a copyrighted work. In the file-sharing context, downloading or uploading substantial parts of a copyrighted work without authority constitutes an infringement.

Penalties for copyright infringement include civil and criminal penalties. In general, anyone found liable for civil copyright infringement may be ordered to pay either actual damages or "statutory" damages affixed at not less than \$750 and not more than \$30,000 per work infringed. For "willful" infringement, a court may award up to \$150,000 per work infringed. A court can, in its discretion, also assess costs and attorneys' fees. For details, see Title 17, United States Code, Sections 504 and 505. Willful copyright infringement can also result in criminal penalties, including imprisonment of up to five years and fines of up to \$250,000 per offense.
